

Other Traditions – Hypocrisy

Matthew 6:2-4

"So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

Tao Te Ching

Chapter 34

Matthew 19:16-26

Then someone came to [Jesus] and said, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?" And [Jesus] said to him, "Why do you ask me about what is good? There is only one who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." [The rich young man] said to [Jesus], "Which ones?" And Jesus said, "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honor your father and mother; also, You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The young man said to him, "I have kept all these; what do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When the young man heard this word, he went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly I tell you, it will be hard for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astounded and said, "Then who can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but for God all things are possible."

Day after day, Heron would carry the fish to a big rock slab, far from the pond, and gobble them up.


One day, the crab decided she should head to the new pond, too.
